<p><b>Monday AM</b> <b>Maths -</b> How short/tall are the people in your family? Measure yourselves and order from shortest to tallest.</p>	<p><b>Tuesday AM</b> <b>Maths -</b> Find 5 objects and compare them from shortest to tallest. Can you measure them? How tall or short are each object?</p>	<p><b>Wednesday AM</b> <b>Literacy -</b> Read or listen to some Greek myths. You could read 'The Trojan Horse'. Can you write your own myth using the character, setting and event provided?</p>	<p><b>Thursday AM</b> <b>U+W -</b> Can you find Greece on a world map? Have a look on Google Earth and explore what you can see.</p>	<p><b>Friday AM</b> <b>EAD -</b> Use clay or play doh to create your own Greek pot. Think about the patterns you might include.</p>
<p><b>Monday PM</b> <b>Phonics -</b> Cut out the words and hide them around the house. Ask a grown up to say a word and race to see who can find it first.</p>	<p><b>Tuesday PM</b> <b>Phonics -</b> Play 'I spy'. Can you find all of the words?</p>	<p><b>Wednesday PM</b> <b>Phonics -</b> Tricky word relay race. Cut out the tricky words and put them in a bowl at the finish line. Run to the end, grab a word, read it and run back to your team.</p>	<p><b>Thursday PM</b> <b>Phonics -</b> Cut out the words and pictures. Read the word and match it to the picture.</p>	<p><b>Friday PM</b> <b>Phonics -</b> Can you read the comic book? Add sound buttons to help you.</p>
