Fun Facts About Light - Activity 1:

Did you know that light travels at 299,792,458 metres per second? That is seriously fast! The circumference of the earth is approximately 24,000 miles. In comparison, the distance between the earth and the moon is approximately 250,000 miles. This means in just 1.3 seconds, light reflected from the moon will reach the earth! Technically the moon we see every evening is the moon 1.3 seconds ago. Mind boggling!




Reflective Materials- Activity 2:
