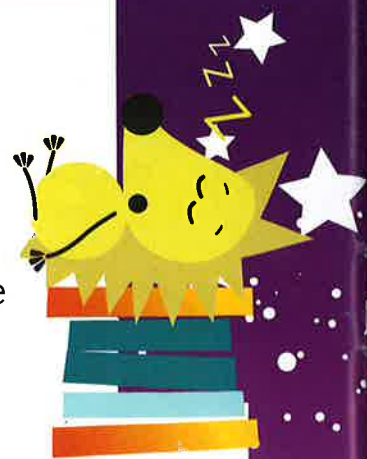


Homophones and near-homophones (2)
