

# Using and, but and or

You can use **joining words** like **and**, **but** and **or** to join sentences.



Steve is big **but**  
Kevin is small.

She has wings  
**and** she can fly.

You can also use **when**, **if**, **that** and **because** to join sentences.

We stayed in **because** it rained.

I will be sad **if** we lose the match.

I can stay up late **when** I am older.

Maria said **that** she was hot.
