

## <u>Music</u>

# Activity 1: Note Duration

The shape of a musical note indicates the **duration** of the note. It tells the player **how long** the sound of the note should last. Watch <u>this clip</u>.



Complete this musical clock by replacing the numbers from the clock face with musical notation that is equal in value (i.e. 1 hour = 1 beat). For example:




# Extra challenges:

• How many different ways can you use musical notation to make each of the numbers on the clock?

$$1 = 0 \quad \text{or} \quad 1 = 0 + 0$$

$$2 = 0 \quad \text{or} \quad 2 = 0 + 0 \quad \text{or} \quad 2 = 0 + 0 + 0 + 0$$

• Rests indicate how long the silence should last for between notes. Can you create another music clock using rest values instead of note values?



#### Activity 2: Famous Composers

For this activity, you will be finding out about the life and music of the famous composer **Frédéric Chopin**.

- Read the information pack about Chopin. You might want to make notes or highlight important information.
- 2. Listen to these four pieces of music composed by Chopin. The dates inside the brackets tell you when he wrote the piece of music.



- Track 1: Nocturne No. 2 (1830-1832)
- Track 2: Ballade No. 1 in G minor (1835-1836)
- Track 3: Piano Sonata No. 2 in B flat minor (1837-1839)
- Track 4: Ballade No. 3 in A flat major (1841)

As you listen, think about the following:

Can you identify any of the instruments? Can you describe the dynamics? (volume) Can you describe the tempo? (speed) Do you like the music? Can you explain why/why not? How does this piece of music make you feel?

3. Use the information you have learned to complete the fact file about Chopin (see below).

#### Extra challenge:

• Research the life and music of another famous composer and/or musician. Complete another fact file about your chosen composer.
