
To draft and edit an informal letter describing feelings

What he might say in his letter


It is so peaceful here on the moon; I often sit for hours admiring the beauty of our universe.

What are the main features of an informal letter?

- Write the baboon's address in the top right hand corner (they need to know where to send their reply)
- Write the date below the baboon's address
- Begin your letter with 'Dear', 'Hi' or 'Hello'
- Adopt a colloquial (chatty and friendly) style of writing
- Include paragraphs to separate topics of conversation
- Include thoughts, feelings and personal comments
- Ask questions for the recipient to respond to
- Sign off your letter with 'Lots of love', 'See you soon', or 'Bye for now'.

Format of an informal letter



Introduction

- Addressing your family
- Asking questions
- Explain why you are writing to them
- Thoughts and feelings

Dear Mum and Dad,

Since I have no other means to communicate with you, I thought I'd try writing you a letter. I miss you both dearly and hope that you're ok. How is everyone back home in Mali? I hope they're missing me too! I can't wait to tell you all about my adventure up on the moon; I hope that I'm making you proud!

Main Body 1

Describe your new house to your family. How does it compare to your home on Earth? Don't forget to include thoughts and feelings!

Main Body 2

- Describe your new job to your family.
- Which parts of it are you enjoying the most?
- Which parts aren't so great?

Have you witnessed any amazing events? Shooting stars etc.

Conclusion

Signing your letter off.

- Final thoughts and feelings.
- What are you now looking forward to?
