## **Teaching School Hub**

At the end of last half term, we had some exciting news. South Farnham School has been selected to become a Teaching School Hub. This newly designated status will build upon the school's experience as a National Support School and Teaching School. South Farnham School is one of only 87 schools in England selected to be a new Teaching School Hub. Each hub will work with a designated area ensuring coverage across the country, serving on average around 250 schools each. They will provide high-quality, professional development to teachers and leaders at all stages of their career and play a key role in helping to build up trainee teachers as they enter the workforce. This will further level up the quality of teaching, allowing every child to receive a world-class start in life, no matter where they are born.

South Farnham School will lead the SESL 11 region (Guildford, Waverley, Rushmoor, Hart, East Hampshire, Basingstoke and Deane) whilst continuing to work with their current partner schools across Surrey, Sussex, Hampshire and the London Boroughs. Relationships with neighbouring Teaching School Hubs, curriculum hubs and national providers will be developed to draw upon the best of regional and national expertise, as South Farnham School introduce some of the most exciting changes to teacher development in a generation.

South Farnham School's designation as a Teaching School Hub has recognised the substantial contribution that it makes to teacher development in the area. We are looking forward to the opportunities that this will provide.




## **Being physical!**

The children have enjoyed being physical now that they are back at school. They have enjoyed using the school facilities including the studios, playground, astros, outdoor play equipment and the outdoor gym.

#### **EYFS**

Throughout lockdown, the importance of physical activity has been highlighted and encouraged, and to help facilitate this, EYFS started a STRAVA group. Not only did it log the children's activity levels, but it also provided the opportunity to look at distances and maps. Some of the maps became very interesting to look at - I think you can see why!

Mrs Weston explained, "After Oak Class' initial 30km challenge (which we completed in a weekend), we quickly progressed to 100km. As our half term challenge, we set our sights on Paris and the Eiffel Tower - a distance of 507km. On the first Saturday of halfterm we were soon crossing the Channel. On arrival at the Eiffel Tower on Monday the 22nd of February, we voted to carry on and head straight to the beach. Luxembourg and the temptation of chocolate was a very close second, but Bordeaux and a further 531km was decided. As soon as the remaining two weeks of lockdown were confirmed, we soon realised that reaching Bordeaux was going to be a challenge. However, with good weather and some exciting Bourne Wood action in the mix, during the first week of this next challenge, we covered our biggest distance of 341km. With an additional 25km completed just at the end, we made it to Bordeaux. We are so proud of the children!"



#### **Return to school**

Once the re-opening of schools was confirmed, the Infant Site PTA set up their 'Lockdown Legend -Run Back To School' initiative. This encouraged children to mark the transition from Remote Learning back to the classroom by running, scooting, walking or cycling 5km. This was a highly successful

initiative and was very much enjoyed by the children and parents. We hope the children liked their medals and will keep them safe as a reminder of the tremendous resili-



## **STEM Competition**

Earlier this term, the children were given the challenge to create an invention with an environmentally friendly theme. For older children, this included explanations of why they had chosen their specific design, accompanied by any influences. We were highly impressed by the entries returned, especially as some children had created their own inventions. We look forward to designing more competitions in the future!



## **Summer Production**



## Easter Service


