Sport

Cricket

Over the Summer term, South Farnham has competed in 4 cricket events across different age groups. The Year 5 teams were unlucky in group matches but showed great determination and team spirit throughout the events. A Year 6 team had a close encounter with Waverley Abbey where the thrilling game went down to the final ball. Needing a wicket for victory, the Waverley Abbey batsman defended the ball which meant we lost by a single run. The boys should be proud of the attitudes they showed throughout and the efforts they put in. Another group of Year 6 boys played some wonderful cricket in their tournament and qualified for the county finals. After some tense qualifying games, they qualified for the main final which went to the last ball as well. Needing to restrict the other team from hitting a 6 the boys got a run out and were crowned county champions. Well done to all the individuals involved this term.









Year 5 & 6 Girls football

The On the 6th of June, 8 girls from South Farnham School represented Chelsea at the Premier League Primary Stars national title. The tournament began at the start of 2023 where 1700 teams entered, and the finals saw the last remaining 20 teams battling it out to become the national champions at Elland Road in Leeds. The girls progressed by finishing top of their group, beating Tottenham Hotspur, Southampton, Crystal Palace and Brentford, before overcoming Manchester United with a 1-0 semi-final win. This led to a final against Brighton where the girls showed real skill, determination and togetherness to win 1-0 and be crowned national winners. The girls should be extremely proud of all the efforts they've shown throughout the different qualification stages, and we couldn't be prouder of their achievements as a school. The summer didn't stop there, as the girls took part in the district tournament. Showing an amazing attitude throughout the girls went on to win the final 2-0 and take home some more silverware. Well done to all the girls who have represented the school this year in football!







Rounders

Safeguarding

Designated Safeguarding Leads

The designated safeguarding lead (DSL) is a crucial role in schools. They are responsible for promoting the welfare of children and ensuring that appropriate safeguarding measures are in place. The DSL acts as the main point of contact for staff, parents, and other agencies regarding any safeguarding concerns. In the absence of the DSL, the deputy DSLs are responsible for safeguarding and child protection matters. These staff members receive additional training to support the DSL in their duties. Attendance

Outstanding school attendance is a top priority at South Farnham School, as attendance has been shown to be a key component in positive academic, social and well-being outcomes for children. At our school, 100% attendance is the expected target and dedicated staff are in place to support you with any issues that might impact your child's attendance. The Government remains very clear that no child should miss school apart from in exceptional circumstances and it is our duty as a school to take steps to reduce absence to support children's attainment. The Department for Education states that missing school for even a day can have a negative impact on a child's progress, which can have a damaging effect on their attainment levels. This year, across the school our attendance has been 96% and whilst this is very good it is still 4% off the DfE expected target. As a school, we want all children

to be in all the time so please let us know if there are any reasons causing attendance worries and we will support you through this process.

You said, we did

As a school we are always looking for new ways to improve. Whether the reasons are academic, sporting, performance or how we can make areas of the school life more convenient for our parents, we want to listen to our community to improve our school.

In the Spring Term and again last week we sent out a parent questionnaire and we were and are so happy with the positive feedback that we received; it was wonderful to read. Whilst that is always pleasant to see, we also saw some really useful suggestions and recommendations and we are pleased to add to our 'You said, we did...' section of the newsletter.

Please see below just some of the actions we have taken after the suggestions you have made:

You Said - We Did

- 1) More sporting opportunities This year we are so pleased to say that our sporting provision grew by 26% across the school. In doing this we have been able to give over 200 more children the opportunity to represent South Farnham School in comparison to last academic year.
- **2) To continue to develop the whole school ethos across both sites** For our KS1 production our junior siblings travelled to the Infant Site to watch their younger brother or sister perform in this year's fantastic production of Madagascar.
- **3)** Larger number of children participating in the Summer production This year our Junior production saw our cast grow to over 100 children with members of the cast, dancers, musicians and choir all collaborating to create the spectacle that was The Lion King. We also built upon the success of last year's debut Infant Summer Production with larger ensemble across Year 1 & 2. We are so pleased that every child who demonstrated an interest in being part of our two productions were all offered a role within them.
- **4) More cookery clubs -** At the Infant Site we have doubled the amount of cookery clubs over Summer Term.

These are just some of the changes that we are making to ensure that South Farnham is a school that supports everyone. Thank you to everyone with their useful suggestions.


Library opening


Year 6 workshops

Science Show

A couple of weeks ago on Monday, Professor Brainstorm visited Year 6 to show us some of his exciting experiments, we were all amazed by all the experiments and our particular favourite was his potato gun. He used a pressurised copper pipe to force the potato out the other end and it ended up on the other side of the gym!

One of his other experiments showed us that even though one small balloon was forced on many different sharp objects, its distribution of pressure meant that the balloon never burst. Finally the experiment using liquid nitrogen has changed our perception of boiling points as the liquid nitrogen evaporated at room temperature.







Year 6 Drumming workshop

Our Year 6 students enjoyed a fantastic Caribbean Drumming workshop, exploring percussion, learning techniques, and embracing the rhythm-filled experience. It was a fun and educational session that fostered teamwork and creativity. We thank the instructor for his expertise and we're excited to see our students' musical talents grow!
